

GFM Services bags RM367.2mil Istana Negara maintenance job

GFM said the five-year contract from June 15 2022, until June 14 2027 involved works related to facilities management services for Istana Negara at Jalan Tuanku Abdul Halim here.

GFM's scope of services comprises operations and maintenance (O&M) in relation to transitional management, architecture, civil and structure, mechanical, electrical, landscaping, computerised maintenance management system, energy efficiency, and repair and replacement, among others.

Apart from the provision of facilities management services, GFM is also the owner of a university asset concessionaire, KP Mukah Development Sdn Bhd, for Universiti Teknologi Mara's Mukah campus in Sarawak.
